Objectives	 To introduce basic concepts and intellectual property (IP) tools. To refine teachers' understanding of copyright and best practice behaviour as educators.

Activity notes	 Ice breaker — Teaching scenarios Distribute scenarios and ask them to work in pairs and ask their partner for advice. Then teachers discuss this question in pairs: What guidelines do you give your students about using material from the internet in their school work? Ask if teachers have ever had any problems with IP infringement at work. They work in pairs and ask their partner for advice. Experts mingle, monitor and give input. Copyright questions Teachers discuss the questions in small groups. Give each group a set of questions. They discuss and choose an answer. Optional — each group works with a laptop to research some of the answers. Possible answers are: A Yes, for free. C No. B Yes, if you pay. D It depends. One person in the group keeps a record of their answers. When the first group has finished, give the answers for all. They then share their findings, discuss and answer questions. Be copyright smart! Teachers work in groups to design and make posters with tips for their colleagues and students. They display posters and do a gallery walk.

B


